

Eco Church

On Saturday 21st September, at St James's Church Hereford, the Bishop of Hereford, Richard Frith, launched Eco Diocese. Responding to the threat of climate change, devastation being caused to the poor across the globe and need for an urgent response, Bishop Richard committed our Diocese to play an active role in combating climate change. This aligns with other local initiatives: Herefordshire Shropshire Councils have declared a Climate Change Emergency and the Herefordshire Green Network has launched 'The Great Collaboration', seeking to work alongside those councils to achieve practical actions on the ground.

Helen Stephens, Church Relations Manager of A Rocha, UK explained the accreditation scheme by which congregations could monitor their progress towards more sustainable living. Progress is accredited with the award of bronze, silver and gold status. There are five key areas on which Churches and Dioceses are assessed - buildings, worship and teaching, lifestyle, community and alobal awareness and churchvards. The approach challenges churches to act in respect of the energy they use, their worship, the wildlife in their churchyards and the ethics of their investments. Online resources are available to help find the right approach and, where churches have embraced the concept, there has been found to be huge support from the local community.

St Peters and St James have registered with Arocha to work towards our Bronze Eco-Church status. A subgroup of the PCC (Peter, Fiona, Don, Elaine and Tanya) is currently looking at this, collecting and submitting data on the 5 topics above.

Try meal planning ahead, only buy what food you actually need, and don't be tempted by BOGOF, or bargains unless you really have use for it. Tons of edible food is wasted each year, much of it over the festive season.

A real Christmas tree is lovely, if you have one please check its from a sustainable source, and decide to plant it in a garden after, or donate it to a neighbour who has a shredder and can use it for garden mulch.

I pray we would all be able to celebrate Christmas, while making a joyful, radical and sustainable difference to the planet - our ongoing gift to Gods creation!

Rwanda Report

Sharon Elson, Paul Gill and Peter Strevens are safely back from their trip to Rwanda visiting our link parish at Rugendabari, checking out some of the Grassroots Rwanda projects and working with the Church in the Shyogwe Diocese. We were part of a team of ten, from Hereford, Bishop's Cleeve, Newton Abbot and Dorridge, led by two of the Grassroots Rwanda Trustees, Jim Stevens (made a Canon of Shyogwe while we were there!) and Chairman Peter Muir.

We met old friends and made many new ones. We were on the go from 7am to 7pm more or less every day, visiting projects making water filters and cookers, the growing of avocado and passion fruit saplings.

We looked at projects developing church buildings and classrooms

We visited Healthy Mums groups, Nursery and pre-school classes, Primary and Secondary schools and Vocational Training Schemes.

Paul was able to spend time with those working in prisons and Sharon and Peter had a lively session with Sunday school teachers. One of the most moving visits we had, which was not in the programme, was to a group of Genocide survivors and Genocide perpetrators, who were regularly meeting together, to gain a better understanding of each other and to help heal the wounds of a terrible past. The motto of their group was "Building Unity". It was a very moving and uplifting experience as we prayed together in a circle, holding hands.

We were able to spend a day with our friends at Rugendabari and returned to join in Sunday worship, with Sharon preaching, while Peter and Paul joined in the Sunday school of about 100 children! It was a normal Sunday service, only lasting about three and a half hours!



We bring back greetings from Bishop Jered, Archdeacons Jean Pierre and Eduard, and Pastor Silvestre.

We have much to share with you, but rather than try to cram something in before Christmas, we'll aim to do a full presentation early in the New Year. So watch this space!

In the meantime, please continue to pray for our friends and our Rwandan brothers and sisters in Christ.

Add a Rwandan family to your Christmas present list!

Done your Christmas shopping yet?

No, me neither. But this year, please add the Water Filter Project funded by Grassroots Rwanda to your shopping list. We take our clean and drinkable water for granted as we turn on the tap or take a shower or bath. In many parts of Rwanda, even though the water may be piped, it is still not fit to drink without further treatment. £12.50 will provide a ceramic water filter for a family who could not otherwise afford one. These are made near Shyogwe using local clay and rice husks. The filters are clay pots, which when fired, create tiny holes, which filter out dangerous worms, parasites and other bugs and debris, making the





water drinkable, up to Government standards. Such simple technology, but so effective.

You could give in one of two ways. Either put whatever you can in an envelope, mark it "Rwanda Water Filters" and put it in the offering plate in Church. Alternatively, go to the "Just Giving" website at www.justgiving.com put in "Water Filters" in the search box and it will take to "Grassroots Rwanda, Festive Water Filters" and simply donate!

Go on, do it now, and help a Rwandan family to stay healthy!
